- Lindy Kae supports a closed election.
- Chema and Jiro support an open election.
- Shirley stated contentious elections have sewn discourse in the past and secrecy can lead to speculation and mistrust.

- Director elections
  - o Over 1000 members voted in the election.

Brian Wiedenmeier

- The election required 105 staff hours, the majority of that dedicated to identifying and retaining the third-party election manager.
- 2018-2022 strategic plan draft dashboard is up and Brian asked the board the review and provide feedback.
- Folsom bike lane project has been delayed but should be completed soon.
- Valencia bike lane project (from Caesar Chaves to Market) will begin its public outreach stage, more to

- · Bike Education
  - Cantonese and Mandarin speaking staff attended the Chinese New Year Parade and were able to speak to over 1.000 people.
  - Staff attended the Giant's Fan Fest and spoke with over 1,000 people
- Bike Builds
  - Staff held two successful events this year
  - Another to be held with La Voz Latina in the Tenderloin with Spanish speaking staff and volunteers
- Signed a contract with Genentech to train all their commuter shuttle drivers.
