Constance Cavallas called to order the San Francisco Bicycle Coalition's Regular Board Meeting with a quorum present at 6:30pm.

Car-Free JFK Update - Advocacy Team

6:35pm - 6:50pm (15m)

Janice Li provided an advocacy update on Car-Free JFK, highlighting the following:

- JFK became a car-free street because of the City's emergency order associated with the COVID-19 pandemic, but the goal of expanding of car-free spaces is not new to the SFBC and was included in our last strategic plan.
- A GGP stakeholder group was convened to explore park access needs. They created a report for the SFCTA. The report was accepted, but with bold, polarizing remarks from some of the Supervisors.
- In order for JFK to remain car-free after the emergency order is lifted, the Board of Supervisors must approve an ordinance. This is different than other street projects, which are usually approved by the SFMTA.
- The SFBC is working to understand 1) who will carry the ordinance 2) what the ordinance will include 3) which supervisors will support the ordinance as we continue work on our strategy

Janice emphasized that we cannot do this work alone. Partnering will be essential. She provided the board with information on different ways to get more deeply involved.

Campaign coordinator, Rachel Clyde, will continue the leadership on Car-Free JFK advocacy after Janice departs the SFBC at the end of the month.

Public Comment - Guests

Adrienne shared that she is a prospective board member interested in getting to know how the board works. She expressed no preference for an AD17 candidate at the time.

Bruce share that he is a long-time volunteer and wanted to know the board better. Bruce expressed no preference for an AD17 candidate at the time.
